WORLDWIDE ROSARY IN THE MONTH OF MAY

LIGHT A CANDLE FOR A SPECIAL INTENTION: If you would like a candle lit for a special intention, we can now facilitate your request. We have 3 day burning candles at a cost of €5 per candle. These can be then put through the letterbox of the Parochial House, Kiltoom. The Candles will be lit and placed in the Church of the Risen Christ for the duration of the lit candles.

The government have announced that we can return to Public Mass from 10th May 2021. While this announcement is very welcome, there are similar restrictions in place to what we had last time we were allowed to hold public Masses.

Weekend masses will now take place in both Churches.

Weekday masses will continue to be said in private & livestreamed to the parish facebook page. *As it will not be physically possible to accommodate everyone at weekend masses, the obligation to attend on Saturday/Sunday remains suspended for the moment*

>WEEKEND MASSES (from the weekend Saturday 15th & Sunday 16th May)

The Church of The Risen Christ, Saturday evening at 7.00pm & Sunday morning at 11.30am.

St. Brigid's Church, Sunday morning at 10.00am.

Both Churches will be open 30minutes before mass. We ask you to follow the instructions of the Stewards. Churches will close after all masses for sanitising.

Churches are restricted to a Maximum of 90 people once socially distanced or in defined Pods, **household of 3 of more will sit in the side pews, individuals or couples will sit in the body of the Church.**

Face masks **MUST** be worn (with the exception for medical reasons)

Seats cannot be reserved, and entry will be on a first come basis.

Please do not be offended if the doors are closed, this means we have reached our maximum quota safely allowed in the Church.

>STEWARDS AND CLEANERS - The same requirements as before regarding stewards & cleaners for all Masses are still in place. I take this opportunity to thank our existing volunteers for the great work and commitment they have given.

NO MASS CAN GO AHEAD WITHOUT THE HELP OF STEWARDS & CLEANERS

>FUNERALS & WEDDINGS - Are currently restricted to 50 people.

>FIRST HOLY COMMUNION - Postponed (Parents will be notified if and when we have any updates)

>CONFIRMATION - Parents and Children will be notified as soon as we have dates.

PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING:

We ask you do not attend mass if you are feeling unwell or have any symptoms of or confirmed COVID-19, if you have been a close contacts of a person who has a confirmed or suspected case of the virus, if you are awaiting a result of a covid—19 test, it is suggested that those in the vulnerable category might also stay at home for the moment until vaccinated.

*The number allowed to participate in the mass is **90 people**, which includes the priest and deacon.

*Entrance is through the main door only and all doors will be used to exit the church.

*Please follow the direction of the stewards at all times

*All members of the congregation **are encouraged** to wash and sanitise their hands before leaving home and on entering and exiting the church. If you wish you can bring your own pocket hand-sanitiser with you. People are encouraged not to bring unnecessary items into the church for mass.

*The reception of Holy Communion is in the hand and not on the tongue in line with Government health regulations.

*If you wish to donate financially to the parish, a basket will be placed on a table as you enter the church and you can place your offering/contribution in the basket, and then you will be escorted to your seat. Alternatively, you can post your envelope through the door of the Parochial House, Kiltoom.

To conform with Government Policy & for the protection of health it is mandatory to wear a facemask when attending Mass

(under 12's and those who cannot wear due to medical reasons are exempt).

We ask families not to congregate outside the Churches before or after Masses and to restrict social gatherings afterwards in accordance with public health guidelines.

***It is important and crucial that we take personal measures to keep ourselves and those we love safe and well.**

***Please look out for one another, take care of yourself and please follow the Government guidelines.**
